Harvest continues to see great need in our communities, and often demand is greater than available food supply. But last week, thanks to our partnership with the Assembly of Manitoba Chiefs, Gardewine and The North West Company, we were able to spread love in the North, delivering nearly 16,000 lbs. of baby food to northern First Nations communities in Manitoba.

"It is an honour for AMC to collaborate with Harvest Manitoba on this initiative that builds upon and extends the kindness, generosity and efforts of all who donate," AMC Grand Chief Arlen Dumas stated.

"Harvest's work to help families with food security issues and their work in northern First Nations communities has been exceptional and a great asset especially amidst the COVID-19 pandemic. Many families have experienced challenges during this pandemic, especially with food security, and we are pleased to be able to partner to ensure families receive baby food to help keep the little ones healthy and safe. We look forward to future partnerships and initiatives going forward."

Each community received special Harvest Hampers containing organic baby food pouches, jarred baby food and liquid baby formula. These items and other nutritious, fresh foods are often inaccessible to northern and First Nations communities in Manitoba due to transport costs, so we are excited to be able to feed up to 24,192 babies that we could not normally feed.

> Harvest Food Network Member Spotlight: Steinbach, Manitoba

> For over 25 years Hank Klassen has been Board Chair of South East Helping Hands in Steinbach, Manitoba. He and



his Operations Manager, Louise Broesky, run the large organization, serving 200-300 households every other Wednesday.

Like many organizations, due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, South East Helping Hands has

had to change their day-to-day operations to keep their clients safe. They ensure only two families are in the building at a time, clients are not allowed to touch the food, and plexiglass was installed to keep volunteers on one side and clients on the other.

Because of these preparations, they have remained open throughout the pandemic.

"It was a little trying for a while, but we managed to actually make it very streamlined," said Klassen. "It is actually working better than the old system."

South East Helping Hands serves residents in the city of Steinbach, and also assists other agencies in South Eastern Manitoba – sharing bread, surplus meats, and cheeses. This has been wildly helpful for all the surrounding communities to help feed hungry Manitobans.

Harvest Manitoba is extremely grateful to South East Helping Hands for serving Manitobans in this corner of the province.
