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The holidays are a time to take stock of the events of the year about to end and the new one soon to begin. Here at Harvest, 2021 has brought challenges, but also hopefulness to our organization. The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic continues to hit many Manitobans hard. For seniors on fixed incomes, modest-income families with children, people who live alone dealing with issues of mental health or disability, this past year has been especially difficult. We all know that when times are tough it is those people who have the least that hurt the most, and these uncertain times have been no exception.

This fall and winter the combination of decades high inflation and continued economic uncertainty have created hardship for many others. Harvest has seen a 75% year over year increase in new applications for food assistance in the last 3 months with the total number of food recipients rising to record levels during the holiday season. The new challenges and job losses created by the Omicron variant of the COVID-19 virus is likely to increase demand into the new year.

Thankfully, we are a Community of Harvest Stars and Manitobans have been there to answer the call and give what they can for their hungry neighbours. Donations of food and funds from community food drives and retail partners continue to fill our hampers and create an inventory in our warehouse for 2022. We have been pleased to welcome back hundreds of volunteers to our facility since the implementation of our full vaccination policy in November. Your support has been critical to sorting, packing and delivering Harvest Hampers and so many other tasks that enable us to get food to those who need it through our community food network of food banks and agencies across the province. Thank you to all of you who have taken to help us, and we look forward to seeing even more of you in the New Year.

Thank you as well to those of you who provide us with financial support throughout the year. In this extraordinary year, Harvest has had many additional expenses related to food purchasing, distribution, transportation, and other costs where we need the cash to operate effectively. Thank you for being Harvest Stars and shining so bright in 2021. We could not do what we do without your generosity. If you have not yet had the chance to give this year, please consider making a gift before the end of 2021 to qualify for a charitable tax receipt this year.

A very special thank you as well to our media partners who have shined a light on food insecurity and poverty in Manitoba through interviews and inspirational stories. This month, CBC Manitoba and the Evanov Group held very successful food and fundraising campaigns for Harvest, and I am delighted to share those results with you in the following pages. CJNU has also been broadcasting from our offices this month, and we thank them as well.

Even though we continue to face challenges, we remain optimistic about the New Year 2022. The difficulties of this pandemic will ease in time and the lessons we have learned along the way will help to make Harvest a stronger and more resilient organization. # Evanov Hope for the Holidays Raises over \$75,000 in 12 hour Radiothon

ENERGY 106, HOT 100.5, and 92.7 FM CKJS teamed up this holiday season to make sure everyone in Manitoba can have a holiday celebration. On Friday, December 10, they broadcasted HOPE FOR THE HOLIDAYS live from 6:00am – 6:00pm.

Through food and cash donations, they helped prepare Harvest Hampers to help feed a record 83,000 Manitobans – hungry children, hardworking families and struggling adults this season.

"Thank you to everyone at the Evanov Group for organizing Hope for the Holidays", said Vince Barletta, President & CEO. "The need at Harvest has spiked in the last few months. With a network of more than 325 food banks and agencies across the province, Harvest has become the fourth largest food distributor of its kind in Canada. It collects eleven million pounds of food each year.

I am delighted with our entire Winnipeg team led by our Program Director Adam West for this effort during this time of need for such a worthy organization. 

## The Amazing Journey of a Harvest Meal

How our community of Harvest Stars comes together to put food on 80,000 tables.

## Step 1:

Donations from your hands It starts with a gift. It takes money, tins for the bin, volunteering and corporate giving to make this happen. Let's follow the 16,000 pounds of chicken from Manitoba Chicken Producers that will be the holiday dinner for vulnerable Manitobans this year.





## Step 2:

Collection Eighty-five farm families set aside three-to-five pound chickens for Harvest. Dunn-Rite and Exceldor process, freeze and deliver them to Harvest. Sometimes we pick up chickens and other products in our fl eet of trucks sponsored or purchased with assistance from corporate partners such as Manitoba Blue Cross, Canadian Tire Regent, Tru-Green Recycling, Maxim Truck and Trailer and Walmart Canada.
